Parent Education: Tea with Headmistress

he first session of 'Tea with Headmistress' was held on the 15th November, 2018 and we welcome Ms Sharmila Gurung from the United Christian Nethersole Community Health Service. She shared her experience and knowledge on the topic of 'Relaxation – How to reduce stress in daily life' and kindly offered some useful information regarding mental illness, specifically about anxiety and depression.

Twenty-six parents joined the talk and while many would have already known one of the most important

practices for reducing stress is to exercise, the reminder was important and very timely especially considering the city we live in and the constant pressure we face in our daily lives. Ms Gurung mentioned that our bodies need exercise every day for at least 15 minutes to increase the blood oxygen content. She also invited everyone to do a stretching exercise at the end of the talk and reminded participants to also keep practicing this at home.

As SEKPS is committed to this vision for all those associated with SEKPS to have a positive well-being, it is our mission to provide more opportunities for parents to experience.



o empower our pupils towards becoming life-long learners, our school has identified Self-Directed Learning as a major concern this school year. Self-Directed Learning aims to be pupil-centered where the pupils are responsible for setting their own learning targets, reflecting on what strategies can best achieve their own learning outcomes and evaluating their targets.

Different learning strategies such as e-assessment, e-platform, pre-lesson task and self-reflection have been both widely promoted as well as carried out. Pupils are also provided opportunities to prepare before their lesson, that way gaining prior knowledge that can assist them build a solid foundation.



I. For concept building:

Activities including talks and workshops were arranged in the beginning of the school year explaining to pupils the basic meaning of gratitude. Our teachers, Ms Yeung, Ms Law, Mr Wong and Ms Yiu prepared a talk for different levels of pupils about gratitude. Besides this, English and Visual Arts teachers also helped in furthering pupils' understanding by running a writing and drawing competition.

II. For sample modelling:

A series of Campus TV programmes were produced by our Headmistress, teachers and even parents showing pupils how to discuss and show gratitude to others in daily life. The programmes are shown during lunch time on Fridays.

III. For personal experiencing:

Pupils were also asked to think about how they value items that belong to them in one of their P.E. lessons and also during class teacher periods. In addition, pupils were asked about their thoughts when listening during morning assemblies.

IV. For actual practising:

Pupils were also provided with chances to put gratitude into practice. Activities like 'Note of Thanks' which is a platform for thanking others and an opportunity to respond to relevant current issues.

- to embolden pupils' writing skills




