


SEKPS Mojor Concern 2019-20: LOVE and CARE

For me personally, my view is that although it is essential for pupils to master the knowledge from the textbooks, education should not be bound only within the classroom. Equal importance ought to be applied to promote pupils' awareness of the affairs in society which have an impact during these years. In order to further strengthen our pupils' concept of society, we have arranged a series of workshops and activities. For example, in order to equip the pupils with living skills, we spent time visiting a supermarket in Admiralty and Sai Ying Pun Market. Pupils were able to learn more about what products are sold in these markets and how customers are served. The concept of increase in living costs, such as inflation, was discussed during the day out. Our pupils learnt to treasure the food offered by their parents and show more concern for food wastage.

Other outings into the community our pupils have experienced include the Hong Kong Museum of History and Sam Tung Uk Museum where they discovered a lot about Hong Kong's contemporary history and its older architectural style.

To facilitate the transferring of knowledge gained outside and process it when back inside the classroom, a cross-curricular program called 'Project Learning' was held last year. Pupils from different levels were given a topic and were invited to step out of the classroom to learn more about their community, nature and the environment. An exploration into the life of birds was carried out by Primary six pupils. To process and apply the knowledge gained, all pupils were tasked with applying their knowledge from different subjects. Pupils used numeracy skills when analysing and producing statistic data, creativity skills when making the bird home. Research skills were also used to understand information related to where birds live, what they look like and what they eat. Pupils have gained a greater sense of understanding the importance of promoting environmental values.

With the continual positive contribution from all of our staff, I am confident to say that Sir Ellis Kadoorie (S) Primary School is definitely a good place for pupils to learn and grow healthily.

Hello, Ms Ada. It is the first year you work in SEKPS and you got the Most Commendable Supporting Staff Award. How do you feel?






Little Reporters: Ms Yeung and Mr Wong, do you have anything to share with all pupils in SEKPS after receiving the Most Commendable Teachers Award?




